- Bound volumes must be supported in a book cradle with no pressure applied to the binding. Snakes or weights may be used and are available.
- Items archivally housed in mylar may not be removed from their sleeves.

 collections and therefore cannot grant or deny permission to publish them, nor do we assume
 responsibility for determining their copyright status. The copyright law of the United States
